# THE CITY OF WOODBRANCH VILLAGE SPECIAL MEETING, PUBLIC HEARING & REGULAR MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 29, 2019

The City of Woodbranch Village council met in a special meeting, public hearing and regular meeting at 7:00 p.m., Thursday, August 29, 2019, in the City Hall Building at 58A Woodbranch Drive, New Caney, Texas, 77357. The special meeting, public hearing and regular meeting were called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Vera Craig. Roll call showed as being present Councilman Scott Essmeier, Councilman Larry Beaird, Councilman Mark Kroll, Mayor Vera Craig, Councilman Brent Purser and Councilman Clay Dean. Councilman Clay Dean had questions regarding the progress of the ground storage project since the contracts had been awarded. City Secretary Charlotte Smith reported sending documents, requiring the mayor signature to the engineer's office and publishing the project on the website. Mayor Vera Craig reported all paperwork was with the Texas Water Development Board and they know we are waiting for a response and she feels the engineer is on top of things.

Councilman Mark Kroll had questions regarding the drainage in Lillliput Farms and asked if there was a hydraulic study performed. City Secretary Charlotte Smith stated she thought there had been and the city was in the process of making arrangements for a meeting with the City Attorney, engineers from both Lilliput and the City, the Mayor and the developer to discuss drainage issues. She also reported hearing concerns from residents near the project and understood the engineer from Lilliput was meeting with them and that it appeared the developer was making every effort to address any concerns. Councilman Mark Kroll stated the water should sheet flow to the south. Councilman Scott Essmeier stated he also had residents express concerns and would like to be involved with any meeting that might take place.

The motion to approve items 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 24 was made by Councilman Mark Kroll. The motion was seconded by Councilman Scott Essmeier, motion carried.

Councilman Scott Essmeier had questions regarding the meter installation program for new construction and/or sewer taps so that we don't have the same situation we had with 23 Sweet Gum.

#27. Consider, discuss and/or take possible action to ratify the tax revenue increase of \$19,752.00 reflected in the adopted the 2019-2020 budget

Mayor Vera Craig called for a roll call vote for the ratification of the tax revenue increase. All for the ratification of the tax revenue were Councilman Scott Essmeier, Councilman Larry Beaird, Councilman Mark Kroll, Councilman Brent Purser and Councilman Clay Dean.

Councilman Scott Essmeier stated a resident in Lilliput Farms has placed a gate across the pipeline and asked that it be properly investigated.
